TRADING POST

You can buy T-shirts, jackets, postcards, flashlights, batteries, merit badge books, candy, ice cream, and dozens of other items at the Trading Post. Make sure to earn some spending money to take to camp.

FEES

The fees are based on your unit's date of payment and food service.

BASIC FEE: \$160 per Scout if paid prior to one week before unit comes to camp. Troop cooking - \$87.50 per Scout.

LATE FEE: \$175 per Scout if paid from Monday before camp to the day of camp. Troop cooking - \$105 per Scout.

GREAT TRAIL COUNCIL UNITS ONLY: Early Bird Special prior to May 13 - \$140. Troop cooking - \$87.50.

TROOP PICTURES: Troop pictures will be taken at check-in. The fee per picture is \$6.00. Orders and fees are due at time of photo shoot.

RIFLE/SHOTGUN: Rifle maintenance fees are 10 shots for \$.50 and clay pigeons are 5 for \$ 1. Purchased at the Trading Post.

HORSES: \$20 for Horsemanship merit badge.

MOTOR BOATING: \$5 gas and motor fee.

HOW TO REGISTER

See your Scoutmaster! Your leader has all the information necessary for you to attend with your troop.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Camp Manatoc is operated with the highest regard to health and safety. Each camper is covered by medical insurance for most injuries while at camp.

A physician-signed medical form is required for all Scouts and leaders in camp. Health histories must be updated within the past 12 months and a physical exam conducted within the past 36 months is required of each youth camper and adult under 40. All adults over 40 years of age must show evidence of a physical examination within the past 12 months.

A qualified medical officer gives each camper a medical recheck upon entering camp.

FAMILY NIGHT

Wednesday night is family night at Camp Manatoc. Family members are not to arrive until after 5:00 p.m. as the road access gates will not be unlocked until 5:00 p.m. All vehicles are to be parked in one of our many parking lots. Please do not drive off of the roads onto the grassy areas. Families may bring their own food for a potluck dinner in their son's campsite or may purchase a meal ticket and eat in our historic Dining Hall, Cost is \$5,00. Please let your Scoutmaster know by the Sunday of camp if you are purchasing our meal. A special evening program is planned for all campers and guests followed by the OA Call-Out,

- Flashlight with extra batteries
- Combination lock
- Insect repellent (non-aerosol)
- Cot or air mattress
- Watch and compass
- Camera
